The Montréal Science Centre invites 500 visitors to take part in *The World's Largest Slime-Making Lesson!* The event will take place this month on **June 19 at 2pm** right on site at the Montréal Science Centre located in the Old Port of Montréal.

The attempt will be led by the popular and colourful chemist Yannick Bergeron in partnerships with Polytechnique Montréal's chemical engineering department.

Rules to be followed to make the attempt a success

To successfully achieve this official attempt at a GUINNESS WORLD RECORD®, it will be important that everyone follow a specific set of rules.

- 1- Arrive at 1:30pm
- 2- Be at least 6 years old (participants must be able to understand the content of the lesson).
- 3- Be accompanied by an adult if you are under the age of 13. Adults will have to make slime too.
- 4- Stay for the entire lesson (90 minutes) which will run from 2pm to 3:30pm.
- 5- Stay seated in your spot.
- 6- Have your ticket in hand, because places are limited. Tickets are on sale on the [Montréal Science Centre website](#).
- 7- Listen to the teacher, Yannick Bergeron.
- 8- Make two different slime recipes.
- 9- Have lots of fun and be proud

Everyone taking part must agree to be filmed and photographed during the event. This is a requirement of Guinness World Records so that the attempt can be officially verified.

Your tickets give you access to the Montréal Science Centre for the whole day of June 19, including access to the new exhibition *The Science of Guinness World Records*®.
